# What is org-capture?

- ▶ Record content from anywhere
- ▶ Configurable templates
- ▶ Store in org-mode files

# How I use org-capture

**Coding** To make note of interesting code snippets

**Reading** To record quotes or excerpts

**Standup** Used to be part of a distributed team

**Journaling** Record thoughts and feelings

## Two important things

```
;; C-c c is for capture, it's good enough for me  
(define-key global-map "\C-cc" 'org-capture)  
;; force UTF-8  
(setq org-export-coding-system 'utf-8)
```

## Basic org-capture template

```
;; configure org-capture templates
(setq org-capture-templates
  '(("t"                ; hotkey
     "Todo list item" ; name
     entry              ; type
     ; heading type and title
     (file+headline org-default-notes-file "Tasks")
     "* TODO %?\n %i\n %a") ; template
  ...)) ; snip
```

## Template stored in file

```
("j" "Journal entry"  
  entry (file+datetree "~/org/journal.org")  
  (file "~/.emacs.d/org-templates/journal.orgcaptmpl"))
```

# Journal template

```
**** %U %^{Title}  
%?
```

Yields ↓

```
**** [2015-01-31 Sat 19:54] This is only a test  
This is naught but a test journal entry for  
the purposes of illustration.
```

# Capture template placeholders I use most

(There are more than this)

Placeholder	Meaning
%U	Inactive timestamp
%^{Name}	Prompt for something
%a	Annotation ( <code>org-store-link</code> )
%i	Active region
%?	Cursor ends up here



## Select-from-list prompts

```
%^{Tidbit type|quote|zinger|one-liner|textlet}
```

# Tidbit capture

```
("b" "Tidbit: quote, zinger, one-liner or textlet"  
entry  
(file+headline org-default-notes-file "Tidbits")  
(file "~/emacs.d/org-templates/tidbit.orgcaptmpl"))
```

# Tidbit capture template

```
* %^{Name} captured %U
  %^{Tidbit type|quote|zinger|one-liner|textlet}
  Possible Inspiration: %a %i
  %?
```
